


Medical Control Privileges

Purpose: To establish minimum requirements for licensees applying for and retaining medical privileges within the jurisdiction of this medical control.

- I. Minimum requirements for providers
 - A. EMS personnel shall possess a valid State of Michigan license.
 - B. EMS personnel shall possess a valid BLS Healthcare Provider card from the most current version of the BETP Standardized EMS Continuing Education Guidebook
 - C. Personnel licensed at the MFR level and above are subject to other MCA specific requirements as outlined below
 -  D. Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) from the most current version of the BETP Standardized EMS Continuing Education Guidebook
- II. Minimum Life Support Agency Requirements
 - A. Valid State of Michigan license.
 - B. Medical Control approved electronic patient care record.
 - C. Responsibility for their EMS personnel meeting the requirements of this and other applicable protocols.
 - D. Compliance with protocols.
 - E. Notification of the medical control authority if they are unable to meet or comply with any protocol, statutory or regulatory requirement.
 - F. Compliance with the minimum staffing and equipment requirements as defined in P.A. 368 of 1978, as amended.
- III. Training Standards:
 1. All personnel must demonstrate an understanding of the National Incident Management system and complete training in the FEMA IS 100, 200, 700, 800 courses. A certificate of completion must to be provided to the hiring agency within 90 days after being hired. DEMCA reserves the right to request verification of completion.
 2. All new providers must complete and pass the most current DEMCA protocol assessment prior to providing patient care. The assessment will be administered by the provider's sponsoring agency. Successful completion score and attempts allowed will be determined by DEMCA's Medical Control Board.
 3. All new providers must demonstrate practical competency prior to providing patient care by verification of at least twelve (12) hours of practical skills training with an agency approved training officer
 4. All providers will complete Annual DEMCA Knowledge Assessments. The assessment will be administered by the provider's sponsoring agency. Successful completion score and attempts allowed will be determined by DEMCA's Education Committee.
- IV. Scope of Privileges
 - A. A licensee's scope of medical privileges shall be granted to the equivalent of those granted his/her employer agency operating within the jurisdiction of this medical control authority.
 - B. In circumstances where a licensee is dually employed, he/she may exercise privileges to the limit of his/her employer agency of the moment (i.e., a paramedic who is employed by an advanced life support agency and a medical first responder agency may only practice to the level of privileges granted to the agency on whose behalf he/she is acting).
 - C. Certification to practice within the DEMCA will be terminated if:

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The licensed individual fails to meet re-licensure requirements of the Department, or has his/her license revoked, or suspended by the Department. Endorsement will be reinstated when:

1. Proof of re-licensure by Department is provided.
2. Passing the most current DEMCA protocol assessment prior to providing patient care
3. Demonstrating practical competency prior to providing patient care.
